DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



CREATIVES MESSAGE

Sally and Roger started working on 18 Eden Avenue about 28 years ago. The storyline was built around three generations of women living at 18 Eden Avenue. Most of the original material has been considerably reworked in the version that is onstage now, thanks to the changes in technology that have occurred since the process began. Back in the 90s, Roger (who is based in Sydney) sent faxes with song lyrics to Sally, and Sally posted cassette tapes to Roger of recordings. When they picked up the show again in 2020 the instant communication online made collaborating a lot easier! They are thrilled to see the show coming to life on stage in Invercargill and would like to acknowledge and thank Repertory Invercargill and especially Jason Fraser for their support for this project.

PROFILES

ROGER GIMBLETT BOOK AND LYRICS

Roger is an actor/writer/director based in Sydney. Originally from Invercargill, Roger studied playwriting with Roger Hall. Roger has written and/or directed numerous performances in New Zealand, Australia, the United Kingdom, India, and South Africa. These include in collaboration with Sally Bodkin-Allen, Flowers at Breakfast, What Santa Does Other Days of the Year, and of course, 18 Eden Avenue.



Roger has worked for Stoll Moss Theatres in London's West End, written for ABC television, and is twice the winner of the National One-Act Playwriting competition. He has directed the Sydney premieres of Andrew Lloyd Webber's By Jeeves and the musical Our House.

SALLY BODKIN-ALLEN COMPOSER AND MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Sally is a born and bred Southlander who teaches music at the Southern Institute of Technology and Invercargill's Out of School Music Classes. Sally's choral compositions have been performed by Femme, the Southland Girls' High School choir, and she has also composed and arranged music for local brass band performers. Roger and Sally have written a number of musicals together, and these have been performed throughout New Zealand and Australia. Sally's passion is musical theatre, and she is absolutely thrilled to see 18 Eden Avenue come to life on the stage at Rep House.



JASON FRASER DIRECTOR

Jason has been involved in theatre for 30 odd years, originally as a lighting assistant, he then got his first role in Invercargill Operatic Society's production of Evita in 1992. Since then Jason has been a regular performer in the Southland community. Most notably as Skimbleshanks, The Railway Cat in Cats, Sir Andrew Aguecheek in the Shakespeare in the Park production of Twelfth Night, and most recently, as the hilarious Mr. Mickleby in Repertory's production of Wanted - One Body! earlier this year. Jason made his directorial debut for Repertory in the 2018 production of Blackadder goes Forth, The Play. In 2021 he once again adapted Blackadder, The Golden Age for the stage, which went on to win 5 OSTA awards.

HANA SKEGGS CHOREOGRAPHER

Hana is delighted to be involved as choreographer in the world premiere of 18 Eden Avenue. She enjoys all aspects of theatre productions whether she is performing, choreographing, directing or appreciating the talents of others from the auditorium. Hana began performing with Invercargill Musical Theatre at age 16 in shows such as Copacabana and Chicago and works annually in the production team of the ILT Christmas Variety Show where she thrives creating magic for the community. By day you will find Hana teaching at La Muse. Hana would like to thank her daughter Ava, for her love and support and the stellar team who bring you this wonderful evening of creative gloriousness.



NEIL MCDONALD ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

Neil McDonald is a seasoned Southland performer who has recently made the move to working backstage and directing. He played Dr. Dillamond in Wicked in 2019, Baldrick in Blackadder The Golden Age, and Legles in Les Misérables in 2021. In 2019 he also played Tupolski in Pillowman for which he was nominated for an OSTA for Best Lead Male. This year he worked backstage for Wanted-One Body! Neil has studied theatre at Waikato University and Victoria University and this year joined the Repertory Committee.



SYNOPSIS

At the end of an avenue, behind an overgrown garden, stands a run-down historic house, home to three generations of women, Honoria, Sophie, and Poppy.

ACT I

A crisp winter's day and we are introduced to the personalities who live at 18 Eden Avenue.

Gilford, an up-and-coming actor, is the latest boarder to arrive and meets another long-term boarder Arthur.

Poppy, the youngest of the family, immediately takes a shine to Gil and declares that she will write a classical Greek tragedy for him.

Honoria the matriarch, is struggling with her own mortality and failing health. She explains the reason why she recites plays, novels and when she dreams at night. Simon is the next-door neighbour and school friend of Poppy but he wants to be more than just friends.

Sophie, Poppy's Mother is concerned about the state of the house as she has been told that the dance school she teaches at is closing down.

Sophie and Arthur meet in secret as Arthur explains that he wants to tell the family the truth about the anonymous Frenchman. This does not go down well with Sophie. She pleads with him to wait until summer, to which he agrees.

Interval of 15 minutes

ACT II

It's now summer and Poppy's play is being workshopped. As Poppy directs the scene, she gets increasingly frustrated with Simon's immaturity and Simon quits. Gil asks Sophie to step in to finish the big romantic scene, and sparks fly! Sophie receives a call from the bank about overdue mortgage repayments and realises that Honoria has been dabbling in the trust account. She becomes inconsolable.

It's the night of Poppy's 16th birthday party. During the party, Simon makes a fool of himself and leaves, Poppy comes to check on him and Simon tells Poppy how he really feels. Arthur interrupts and decides now is the time to talk to Poppy about the family secret.

Having resolved the family issue, Arthur gets an invitation to leave 18 Eden Avenue and join Mrs. Hodgkins' Old Time Song and Dance Troupe, which he decides to do. With Arthur leaving and Poppy off to the School Ball with Simon, Sophie is distraught and overwhelmed by all the changes.

Gill arrives home after his latest gig depressed and decides to quit acting and get a real job.

Sophie declares that she wants to set up a performing arts school for kids in the house and offers Gill a job.

He agrees, and together they toast a great new adventure.
